

Infanrix hexa (GSK) or Vaxelis (Sanofi Pasteur) Hexavalent vaccine DTaP/IPV/Hib/HepB Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), polio, Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) and hepatitis B

8,12,16 weeks



Pneumococcal (13 serotypes)

12 weeks and 1 year



Bexsero (GSK) MenB

Meningococcal group B

8 weeks, 16 weeks and 1 year

Rotarix (GSK) Rotavirus (oral)

Rotavirus gastroenteritis

8 weeks and 12 weeks

1 year
